THE LEAGUE STORY

The League of Women Voters was founded by Carrie Chapman Catt in 1920 during the convention of the National American Woman Suffrage Association. The convention was held just six months before the 19th amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, giving women the right to vote after a 72-year struggle. The League of Women Voters began as a "mighty political experiment" designed to help 20 million women carry out their new responsibilities as voters.
